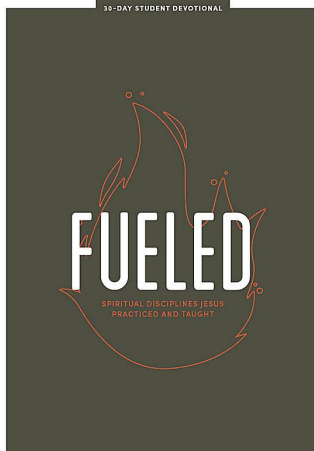
### **Learning Outcomes:**

- 1. Community-**Develop a servants heart.- The objective with working at the Shelter is to demonstrate Ministry and serving the community. By partnering with the Shelter the students will develop work ethic by digging trenches, preparing the grounds for farming, and working with families at the shelter. Some of the goals include:
  - a. Community farm
  - b. Beautifying the premise
  - c. Working with kids from the shelter
  - d. Write a paper on what they can do to help their local community.
- 2. Career-**Exposure to different career paths and choices- The church, has all the resources and connections to help raise young people to be effective leaders. We are partnering with local businesses to expose students to opportunities in the marketplace. We aim to give them an example of faith lived out in the community. To maximize this opportunity each student is expected to:
  - a. Research the company for Homework every Wednesday evening. They are required to identify certain facts about the company that interest them. They will come up with 5 questions before reporting to the Thursday Session.
  - b. Tour of the company. Each of the business partners have agreed to host the team of students in a tour of the facility, share a leadership principle, and facilitated a question and answer period. Lunch will be provided by the program.
  - c. Each student will have to write a paper to process their experience to be turned in by the following week on Wednesday.
- 3. Develop leadership and inner-man. Chapel-** The objective with chapel is to foster a spiritual atmosphere within the team. Each Friday we will have various speakers that will address the students a topic to address their inner man. Throughout the program each of the students will be given “Habitudes- Self-Leadership”. The objectives:
  - a. Finish the book
  - b. Ministry through various topics

Those who participate in all the days and complete the necessary work will receive a certificate of completion of the youth internship program.

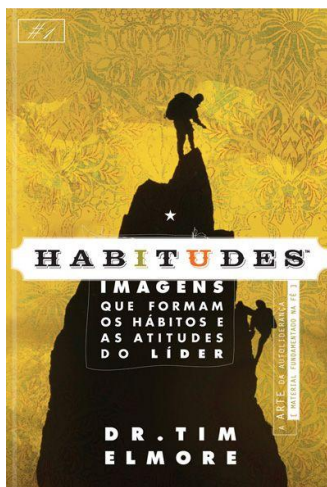

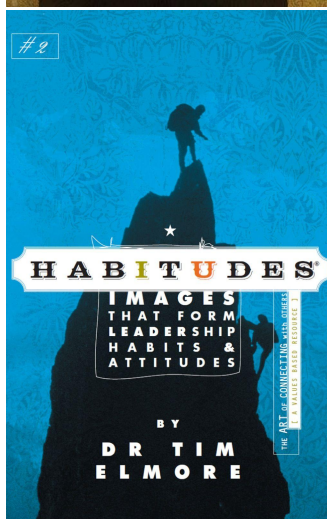
#### LEARN FROM THE MASTER.

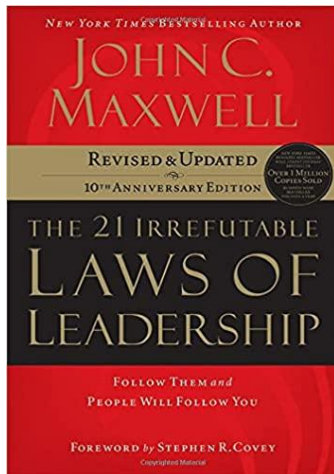
